STARDIT is an open access data-sharing system to standardise how information about initiatives is shared across diverse fields, including citizen science<sup>1</sup>

Aim -enable many kinds of data to be reported in a standardised way across disciplines

STARDIT has been co-designed with multiple stakeholders around the world<sup>2</sup> 2019

Stage 1: Alpha version development

Stage 2: Public Consultation

Stage 3: Beta version development


Co-design led by Science for All with global stakeholders involved in the following tasks at each stage:

Used by the Wikimedia Foundation-supported open-access journals<sup>4</sup> The ongoing co-design process is being hosted by 'Science for All' 5



STARDIT is designed to be interoperable with existing data standards Reports can be completed in multiple human languages<sup>6</sup>
